JOIN THE IPI

FOUNDED IN 1975, THE IRISH PLANNING INSTITUTE IS THE ALL-ISLAND PROFESSIONAL BODY REPRESENTING PROFESSIONAL PLANNERS ENGAGED IN PHYSICAL, SPATIAL AND ENVIRONMENTAL PLANNING IN IRELAND AND IRISH PLANNERS PRACTICING OVERSEAS.

The Irish Planning Institute's mission is to advance planning in the interest of the common good by serving, improving and promoting the planning profession.

The IPI uses revenue from events and also membership subscriptions to further its work to advance planning and serve the planning profession.

90% of IPI members would recommend membership of the IPI to an eligible colleague.

Joining the IPI directly supports the planning profession. The IPI gives a voice to members through various public statements and publications on important planning matters. IPI members also receive exclusive access to publications, resources, advertising opportunities and job listings as well as a range of other benefits.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

Student – Student membership is available to those undertaking an IPI accredited planning course. The IPI supports students in taking the first steps towards a planning career.

Graduate – Graduate Membership is available to planners who have attained a recognised or accredited professional planning qualification, but who have not, as yet, obtained the necessary experience to qualify for Corporate Membership.

Corporate – Corporate (full) Membership is the foremost membership category within the Institute and is open to planners who have at least two years post qualification planning experience and who have reached a required standard of knowledge, skill and professional responsibility necessary to engage in planning. Corporate members can use the designatory letters MIPI which acts as a 'mark of quality' and shows a dedication to continuous professional development to colleagues and employers.

Affiliate – The Institute also includes as eligible for Non-Corporate membership persons who have a primary or post-primary degree (or equivalent) related to planning, who have been engaged for a minimum of two years in approved research or practice related to planning, and who have made a special contribution, in the opinion of the Council, to planning in Ireland.

Fellow – Fellowship of the IPI is available in recognition of senior planning professionals with extensive professional experience, who have made an important contribution to the Irish Planning Institute.

Reduced overseas, retired and unwaged membership rates are available for eligible members.
